


2.4 million international arts tourists in Australia in 2013-14


Arts tourism has grown with the number of international arts tourists increasing by 19% over the last four years. Visiting a museum or art gallery is the most popular form of arts tourism with more than one in four international tourists doing this in 2013–14, at similar levels to the UK and USA. More international tourists engage with arts than go to wineries, casinos, or organised sports.

International revenue from sales, royalties and copyright is important to Australian arts. This can be difficult to measure but some indicative sales results are:

Professional artists engagement overseas increases as careers progress. Over half of established Australian artists have taken work overseas, compared to one in three artists who are becoming established.
